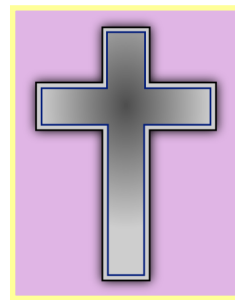

What value did you show this week to your friends? Which value do you think you will be able to show next week?



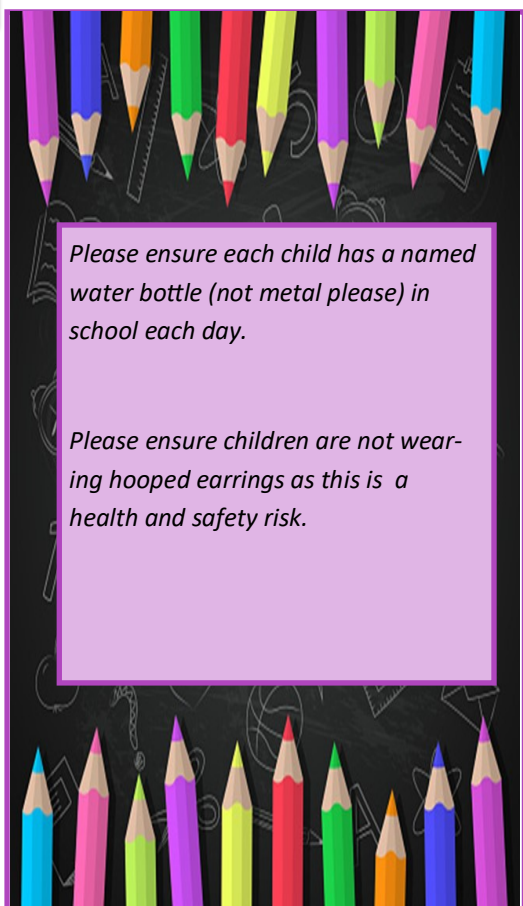

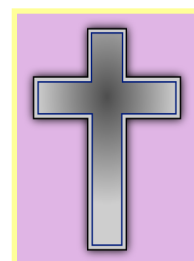

Is Roblox safe for my child? Information to help you decide if Roblox is suitable for your child



Roblox is a gaming platform where players can create and publish their own games. The platform can be a great educational tool to help teach children new skills like coding. However, there are also some risks.

Roblox allows players to build and publish their own games. This means that other users could build games that contain adult or inappropriate themes that your child might see.

Players can use the communication features of Roblox to talk to one other while they are playing. This means that there is a risk of cyberbullying or unwanted contact.

Roblox does have [Community Standards](#) that outline what behaviour is and isn't acceptable on the platform. They also have moderators who review and remove inappropriate content. They also have a range of parental controls and safety settings that can help keep your child safer on the platform.

This survey is part of the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) funded by NHS England in partnership with the Department of Education, Department for Health and Social Care and the National Network of Parent Carer Forums (NNPCF).

The purpose of the project is **to improve the experience of mainstream school for children who may have an additional educational need**. The information from the survey will be used to understand the current strengths

The survey is for all parents and carers of children attending schools participating in the project. **If you have more than one child attend the school, then you may complete the survey for the number of children you have attending the school.**

All information provided will be stored, used and accessed confidentially in accordance with Data Protection legislation.

The individual information provided will only be accessible to the Harrow or Hillingdon Parent Carer Forum. **Your individual survey response will NOT be shared.** The only time information will be shared is if it raises a concern for someone's safety.

A thematic summary of the survey results will be shared with your participating school and PINS project partners from NHS England, Department of Education and NNPCF.

Due to being anonymous, this survey is not a suitable way to raise any specific concerns you may have about your child(ren) or their school. It is also not suitable for reporting any safeguarding concerns. If you have any safeguarding concerns relating to your child or other children in the school, please contact the school Designated Safeguarding Lead in the first instance, and follow your school or local area protocols.

Camping Breaks at Church Farm

At Church Farm Ardeley we have natural camping fields which offer a wonderful opportunity for larger groups of families to book school class camping trips as well as individual family stays.

Accommodation includes the hire of bell tents and cabins (with or without 'glamping' options), as well as multiple woods and fields to pitch your own tents. All large groups are allocated roped-off private areas so that they can all camp together.

We offer a variety of options to enhance your stay including BBQ packs and food. There is also a pub and restaurant (jollywaggoner.co.uk) as well as our farm café for the all-important teas, coffees and bacon rolls.

Camping at the farm also includes free farm passes (usually from £6.95pp per day) for the duration of your stay. Get to know the animals, explore our woodland play area, follow the farm trail, and find out about growing and horticulture in our polytunnels and kitchen garden. And there are plenty of beautiful family walks in the peaceful, rolling Hertfordshire countryside.

Additional bookable activities include Egg Collecting, Goat Walking, Fairy Trail, Animal Feeding and (from Feb-April) Lamb Bottle Feeding.

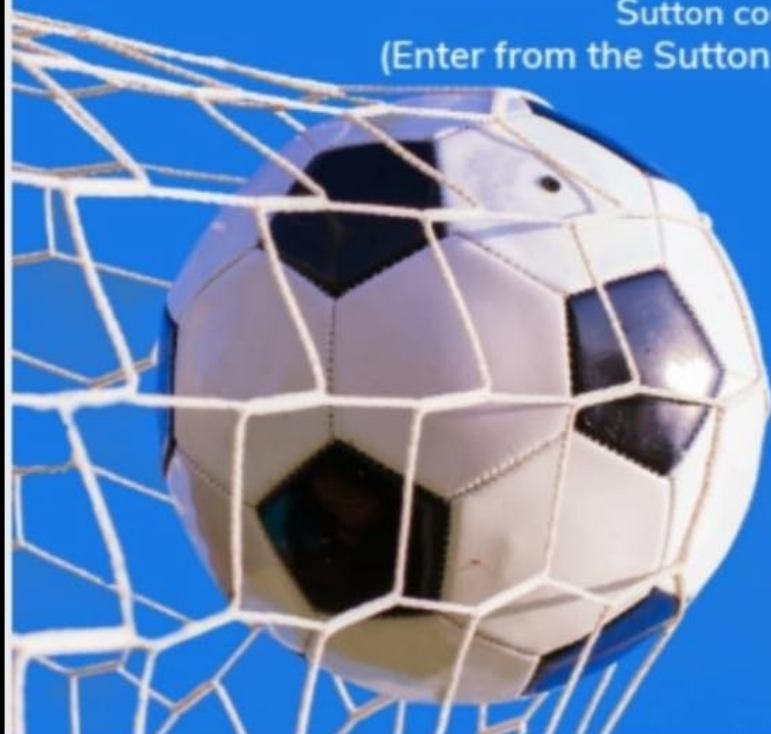
