<ul> <li><u>Stone Age</u> <ul> <li>The Stone Age was when early humans used tools from stone. This is also known as pre-history.</li> <li>At the end of the Ice Age, the sea levels rose and so Britain turned into an island.</li> <li>The Stone Age had three periods - Palaeolithic ('old' Stone Age), Mesolithic ('middle' Stone Age) and Neolithic ('new' Stone Age).</li> <li>Palaeolithic Stone Age lasted until the end of the Ice Age. Early humans used stones as tools. This lasted till about 10, 500 BC</li> <li>Mesolithic Stone Age was from about 10, 500 BC to 4, 000 BC. Humans would demonstrate a variety of ways to gather food including hunting and fishing.</li> <li>Neolithic Stone Age was from 4, 000 BC to about 2, 500 BC. This marked the start of farming including land clearance and the keeping of animals.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		Key Knowledge

		BC	BC stands for 'Before Christ' and means the number of years <b>before</b> the year <b>0</b> – when Christians believe Jesus was born.
		AD	AD stand for 'Ano Domini' – which means 'in the time of our Lord'. AD is used for all years after the year <b>0</b> .
