Please see some important information below:

**UNIFORM** – Thank you for sending your children to school looking so smart. To ensure nothing gets lost or swapped, please make sure that all clothing brought to school is clearly named. This will enable us to return it to you.

I hope you understand that to maintain high standards we do speak to children who are not wearing the correct uniform. Slips will be sent home to any child that is not in correct uniform.

**ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL**—Lessons start for the children at 8:50am. The school gates will open at 8.35 for the children to enter. The children will be collected by their class teacher at 8.45am. Any children arriving after 8.45am should be accompanied to the School Office to be signed in. Any parent who wishes to see the class teacher personally should contact the school office to make an appointment.

**END OF DAY**—Children finish lessons at 3:20pm and are taken onto the playground by their class teacher. The children wait with their teacher until they see the adult who is picking them up. If they are not collected by 3:25pm, they will be taken to the school office. If you know you are going to be late, please call the School Office on 01895 462350 by 3.05pm at the latest. We will then ensure that your child does not go into the playground but waits for you in reception. Please note that the school office closes at 4:00pm

If your plans change during the school day and somebody else needs to pick your child up, please notify the School Office so that we can let your child and their class teacher know. If somebody turns up to collect your child and your child was not expecting to go with them, we will need to make contact with you before the child is allowed to go. Please contact the school office for the daily password.

**PERMISSION TO WALK HOME ALONE**—If you are happy for your child to walk home on their own after school (including after Clubs), please email the School Office at stmartins@fraysacademytrust.org to enable us to update our records. This permission will remain in force during your child's time at St Martins. **This applies to Year 6 children only.** 

**MOBILE PHONES** - Year 6 children may bring a mobile phone to school if they walk home unaccompanied. The phones will be kept in a secure place and children should collect these from the school office at the end of the school day. The school will not take responsibility for any phones not handed in to an adult. For safety and privacy reasons, children are not allowed to have their phones out on school premises unless they have been given permission to do so by their class teacher.

**LUNCHES**—All children in Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) are entitled to universal free school meals. All children in Key Stage 2 (Year3,4,5 & 6) are entitled to a free school meal under the Mayor's Funding Programme. Meals will need to be ordered/pre-selected for each day. If you believe you may be entitled to free school meals through Pupil Premium please fill out a form available from the office. **PARKING**— Residents would like your support with a petition addressing parking issues : see QR code attached for more information.
